



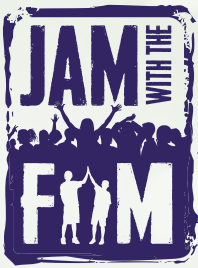

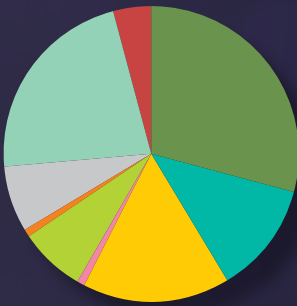

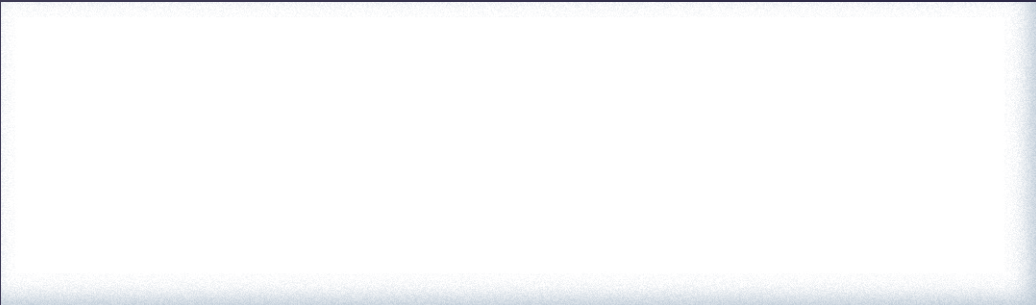

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# LOOKING BACK

Our story began nearly two decades ago when the Community Foundation of Henderson County formed a Blue Ribbon Committee of local leaders to review the needs of children in our community. They determined that there was a need for a place where families could go for advice, resources, and support.
